

### Our Brands







#### **MD House**

Inspired by essential beauty, harmonious lines and colours, along with quality wood finishes with artisanal-style detailing. Every production process is carried out in-house by a company that loves to spread the culture of Italian design and know-how. An ever-growing range of modular furniture systems for the living room and bedroom, all designed with an eye on the very latest home furnishing trends.



#### Riva 1920

A family-owned business that has been producing timeless, solid wood furniture in Northern Italy for more than three generations. Their philosophy remains simple: to embrace the unique and unpredictable nature of wood and respect the environment.



Fiam

Founded in Italy by Vittorio Livi in 1973, FIAM has become a leader in the design industry after becoming the first company to produce furnishing items in curved glass.

Using advanced technology while partnering with top international designers has allowed the brand to build a collection that includes award-winning designs that are recognised around the world.









#### **Bonaldo**

Bonaldo's history began more than seventy years ago. In 1936 Giovanni Bonaldo started his artisan processing of metals for the furniture field. Today, the company has grown to be one of the most respected furniture manufacturers in Europe.

#### **Eforma**

The eforma philosophy expresses the centrality of a project that only sensitivity to design and tailoring can transform into unique objects, capable of enriching the beauty and functionality of the environment in which our life takes place. Each product is made strictly by hand in their Thiene factories.

#### **Ethimo**

Specialising in high-quality outdoor furnishings and décor, Ethimo takes its inspiration from the warm, inviting colours of the Mediterranean and the charm of humble, authentic places. Its contemporary design collections are made with comfort and practicality in mind and enhance any outdoor area.

#### Paola Paranetto

Paola began her ceramic training in Umbria and Tuscany, where she learned the main techniques of working with clay. After continuous progress, her "Cartocci" collection came to life, a rich series of sculptural objects that is ever-evolving and available in an expansive palette of colour options.







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#### San Maurì

An Italian bistro with excellent wines and a menu of interesting pairings such as cod and coconut, as well as one of the best Milanese risottos. You'll find farm-to-table ingredients and kind service. Don't miss the toilets – the sink is 500 years old.

#### Ristorante Da Giacomo

A real institution in the city, this old guard restaurant marries the simplicity of rustic Tuscan cuisine with the drama of classic Milanese interior design (the dining room, which features ornate wall paneling and graniglia floors, was designed by the infamous architect Renzo Mongiardino back in 1989).

The extensive menu skews towards seafood, serving dishes like paccheri with swordfish and eggplant, a large selection of raw carpaccio and tartare, plus market-fresh fish, which arrives at the table whole to be served with theatrical flair.



#### Trattoria Madonnina

A quiet side street just off Corso San Gottardo hosts this lost-in-time trattoria, one of Milan's oldest. A small menu is handwritten each day, offering Milanese comfort food at its finest, including. Cotoletta alla Milanese, ossobuco and traditional saffron risotto, which are usually on offer for both lunch and dinner.

In the summer, Madonnina's vineringed patio is scattered with tables, and on Saturday nights, a saxophone player often pops in for a song or two.



#### **ADI Design Museum**

A must if you are into modern Italian design and its history, showcasing 70 years of design across 23,000 pieces.

Design figures such as Bruno Munari, Achille Castiglioni, and Renzo Piano are just some of the names represented in the museum's Permanent Collection with their incredible creations.

The museum spaces host temporary in-depth exhibitions, cross-cutting initiatives and meetings for the general public, with the aim of raising awareness and promoting design culture at both national and international levels.



#### Fondazione Luigi Rovati

The seven-year project for the Fondazione Luigi Rovati marks the completion of the renovation and remodeling of Milan's 19th Century Palazzo Bocconi-Rizzoli-Carraro by Mario Cucinella Architects.

The new series of underground galleries of the Foundation's Etruscan collection are at the core of this innovative addition to the city's cultural and civic life at 52 Corso Venezia. In addition to the Etruscan galleries, the Fondazione Luigi Rovati's art museum houses two floors of exhibition space, a bookshop, a café and a restaurant on its top floor.



#### Villa Necchi Campiglio

The 1930s Villa Necchi, is anchored in its past, with every element of the building carrying the signature of Piero Portaluppi, a main figure in the Italian Rationalism movement.

The villa's interior is a showcase of modernist design, with clean lines, an innovative use of materials, and custom-designed furniture by renowned Italian designer Gio Ponti—a perfect time capsule of modern Italian architecture.



#### **Bar Basso**

The negroni sbagliato was first created at this classic Milanese cocktail bar and is still served today in an enormous glass. Located in Città Studi, an area buzzing with students, Bar Basso fills up during Salone del Mobile, when it becomes the after-party venue of choice.



#### Camparino in Galleria

Camparino n Galleria is the original Campari Bar in Milan, and a true Milan institution. In 1867, Gaspare Campari opened a wine shop in the newly-constructed Vittorio Emanuele II Gallery, which became the Camparino in 1915 and continues to bear the Campari name to this day. Located immediately across from the Piazza Duomo, you can't miss it.



#### The Spirit

You need to be curious and adventurous to find the entrance sign. This cocktail bar located in the hearth of Porta Romana in Milan transports you back to the 80's. Velvet sofas, extravagant mirrors and sparkling lights lure you into a place where the perception of time and the world outside fades away.
